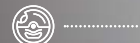

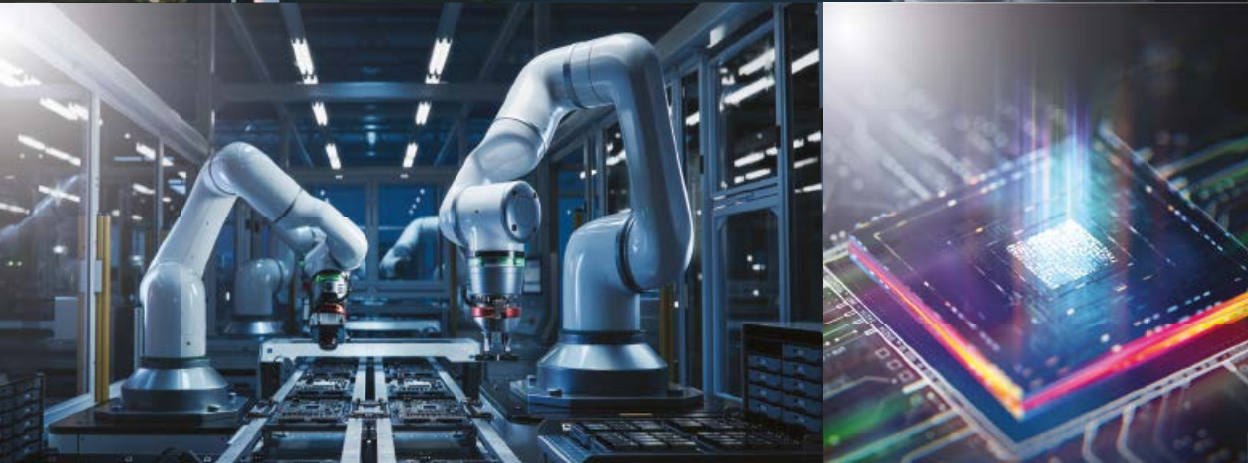

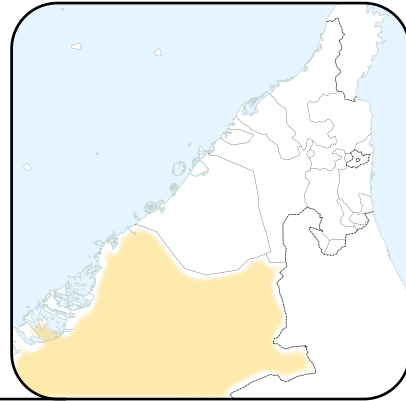

ABU DHABI



Abu Dhabi is the largest Emirate in the UAE, occupying 84% of the national landmass territory. It has 200 islands and a long coastline stretching across 700 km. Its total area is 67,340 km².

Abu Dhabi City in the Emirate is the federal capital of the UAE.

LOCATION AND GEOGRAPHY

The Emirate of Abu Dhabi lies on the coast of the Arabian Gulf and is bordered by the Sultanate of Oman to the east, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia to the south and west, and the Emirate of Dubai to the northeast. The three main regions of the Emirate are the city of Abu Dhabi, Al Ain in the east, and Al Dhafrah in the west. In the eastern region, to the south of Al Ain city is Jebel Hafeet - the Emirate's highest peak (1,240 m).

Al Dhafrah has seven main cities: Liwa, Madinat Zayed, Ghayathi, Ruwais, Mirfa, Sila and Delma Island.

The city of Abu Dhabi is connected to the mainland by four bridges: Maqta bridge, Mussafah bridge, Sheikh Zayed bridge and Sheikh Khalifa bridge.

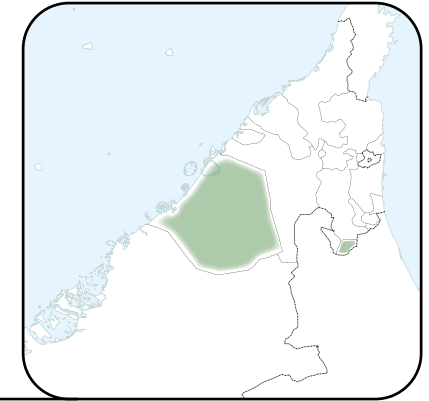
TOURISTIC IMPORTANCE

Abu Dhabi has become a centre for world-class sporting events such as the Abu Dhabi Golf Championship, the prestigious Abu Dhabi Desert Challenge cross-country rally and the Formula One Abu Dhabi Grand Prix.

Additionally, the city houses the world's largest concentration of premier cultural institutions which includes the Sheikh Zayed National Museum, the Guggenheim Abu Dhabi and Louvre Abu Dhabi.

Abu Dhabi is rich in natural wonders, too. While the famous Liwa Oasis in the south of the Emirate is home to some of the largest and most beautiful sand dunes in the world, the garden city of Al Ain in the foothills of Jebel Hafeet is home to several heritage sites.

DUBAI



Dubai is the second largest Emirate with an area of 4,114 km², which is about 5% of the UAE without the islands.

The older districts of Dubai cover an area of 1,500 m². The Emirate has earned the titles of 'Pearl of the Gulf' and 'Jewel of the World' because of its heritage and history.

LOCATION AND GEOGRAPHY

Dubai is located on the eastern coast of the Arabian Peninsula, in the southwest corner of the Arabian Gulf. It shares its boundaries with Abu Dhabi in the south and Sharjah in the northeast. It shares its international border with the Sultanate of Oman in the southeast. Dubai is roughly 16m or 52ft above sea level.

Dubai City is the capital of the Emirate. It is characterized by its historic creek, which divides the city into Deira in the north and Bur Dubai in the south

In 2016, a new addressing system was launched which involved dividing the Emirate into 14 districts.

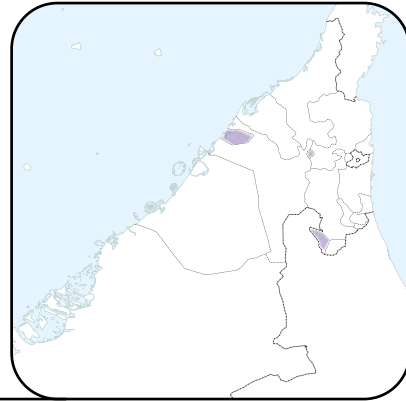
Dubai has several sandy beaches on its western side, a mangrove at the eastern end of the creek, many deserts in the interior and western regions, and wadis in the Hatta region.

TOURISM

Dubai boasts a wide variety of world-class hotels, modern architecture, entertainment and dining venues, traditional markets, shopping centres and sporting event locations.

Some of the major tourist attractions in the Emirate are the wadis of Hatta, the sail-shaped Burj Al Arab hotel, which is also the world's only seven-star hotel, and Burj Khalifa, which is the world's tallest skyscraper.

AJMAN



Ajman is the smallest of the seven Emirates, measuring about 260 km², which is about 0.3% of the UAE's area without the islands. Ajman has a few sandy beaches but is mainly characterised by the rugged Hajjar mountain range. Although Ajman City is modern and provides modern services through digital channels, it still retains its traditional charm.

LOCATION AND GEOGRAPHY

Ajman lies on the coast of the Arabian Gulf, in the northern part of the UAE. It is 16 km long and lies between the Emirates of Sharjah and Umm Al Quwain.

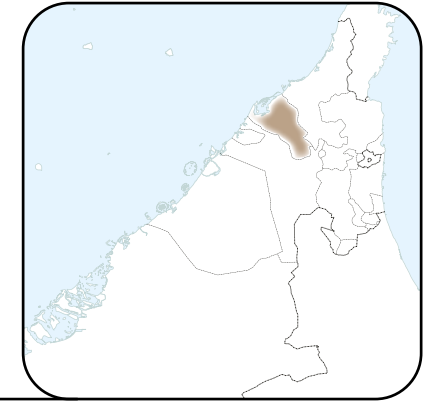
CULTURE AND HERITAGE

Ajman Fort is one of the country's historic landmarks, dating back to the 18th century. The fort has been restored and transformed into a museum. It contains archaeological discoveries and evidence of civilizations from different historic eras.

TOURISTIC LANDMARKS

The magical beaches of Ajman with their fresh air, peaceful environment and clean water play host to a range of marine activities which attract many sea lovers. Some of the major landmarks in Ajman are Ajman Museum, Masfout Castle, Masfout Gate, and the Red Fort.

UMM AL QUWAIN



Umm Al Quwain is the second smallest and the least populated Emirate in the UAE. It covers an area of approximately 720 km², which is equivalent to 1% of the UAE's area.

LOCATION AND GEOGRAPHY

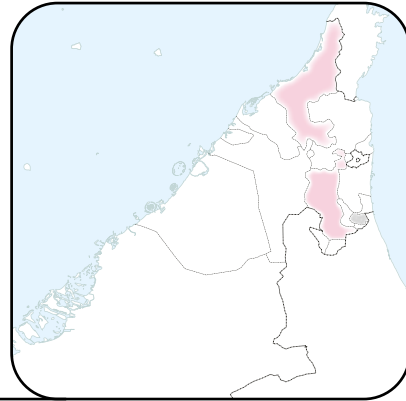
Umm Al Quwain is situated between Sharjah to the southwest and Ras Al Khaimah to the northeast. The city of Umm Al Quwain is built on a narrow peninsula called Khor Al Bidiyah.

TOURISTIC IMPORTANCE

The Emirate is famous for coastal mangroves on the coast of Arabian Gulf and many islands that lie to the east of the mainland. The biggest island, Al Seniah, is home to Arabian gazelles, falcons and turtles.

Umm Al Quwain provides facilities for numerous recreational activities, from sailing to skydiving. Traditional activities such as dhow building and sports such as falconry and camel racing are also popular in the Emirate. Dreamland Aqua Park, the UAE's largest water park and resort, attracts several visitors.

RAS AL KHAIMAH



Ras Al Khaimah is the fourth-largest Emirate and covers an area of 1,684 km², which is equal to 3.16% of the total area of the UAE.

LOCATION AND GEOGRAPHY

Ras Al Khaimah is located near the northernmost point of the UAE and shares its boundaries with the Emirates of Umm Al Quwain, Fujairah and Sharjah. It shares its international border with the Sultanate of Oman.

The city of Ras Al Khaimah is the capital of the Emirate. A creek divides it into two areas: the western old town of Ras Al Khaimah and the eastern part - Al Nakheel. Other key towns are Al Jazirah Al Hamra, Digdaga, Khatt and Masafi. Masafi shares its boundaries with the Emirate of Fujairah and is known for its mineral water. Al Marjan Island, to the south of the Emirate, is a group of four coral-shaped, man-made islands offering hospitality, residential and lifestyle attractions.

Ras Al Khaimah has a strategic geographical location, stretching along the shore of the Arabian Gulf, adjacent to the Strait of Hormuz.

TOURIST ATTRACTIONS

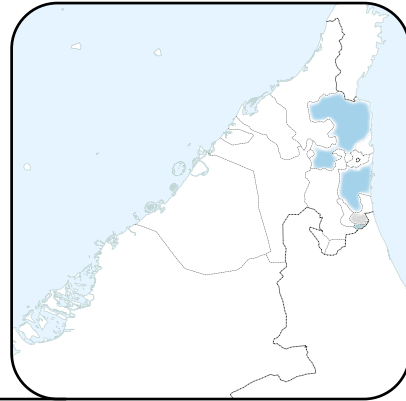
Ras Al Khaimah is an up-and-coming tourism hub. It has scenic locations with diverse landscapes, including rolling sand dunes, coastal strips, salt flats, mangroves and mountains. There are sulfur springs near the mountain areas and the Emirate is also home to a diverse range of wildlife that includes foxes, jerboas and hundreds of bird species.

The highest peak in the UAE, Jebel Jais, is in Ras Al Khaimah. Standing 1,934 m high, it is the site of the world's longest zipline certified by Guinness World Records. The site also offers several other adventure attractions and has the highest restaurant in the UAE. Ras Al Khaimah was named Gulf Tourism Capital for both 2020 and 2021 by the Gulf Cooperation Council.

FUJAIRAH



Fujairah is the only Emirate that is located completely on the eastern coast of the UAE along the Gulf of Oman. The shores of Fujairah extend along the Gulf of Oman for about 70 km from the city of Fujairah in the south to the town of Dibba in the far north. The total area of the Emirate of Fujairah is 1,450 km².

LOCATION AND GEOGRAPHY

It shares its boundaries with the Emirates of Sharjah and Ras Al Khaimah on the west and the Emirate of Sharjah to the south. On the north, it shares its international border with the Sultanate of Oman.

TOURISTIC ATTRACTIONS

Fujairah is distinguished by its rugged mountains, valleys, waterfalls, oases and wide sandy beaches. It has several hot, cold and mineral springs. Because of its easterly location, Fujairah's climate is more moderate than that of Abu Dhabi and Dubai. Weekend visitors looking to escape the heat are drawn to Fujairah's relaxed and peaceful atmosphere. Wadi Al Wurayah waterfalls and Ain Al Madhab Gardens are major touristic attractions, as are the historic Al Bidya Mosque and the Heritage Village.

The stage of the desert. The first part (north-south direction) is about 45 km long, on wide, straight roads. After reaching Liwa, the race enters an area of very pronounced dunes, which make up the bulk of the stage. A series of ups and downs leads to Moreeb Dune, where the race will take two laps of the Moreeb Dune cycle path (18.1 km each lap), marked by rather steep ups and downs with double digit gradients. It then returns to Liwa for the finish. The stage is on wide, straight roads with good pavement.

Starting from Ras al Khaimah, the race reaches Al Marjan Island and returns to the desert. After the Ras al Khaimah airport, the race heads straight for Jais Mountain. The final climb is approximately 20 km long at constant 5% gradient, with slightly higher gradients around 7% in the last 2 km.

The final climb winds through wide-ranging hairpin bends on a 3-lane roadway. Gradients are mainly around 8-9% with a peak of 11%, 3 km from the finish. There is a very short descent in the last km, before the last ramp. The finish line is on straight asphalt.

AL JAHILI FORT

One of the UAE's most historic buildings, built in 1891 to defend the city and protect palm groves. It also served as the headquarters for the Oman Trucial Scouts and a residence for the local governor. Set in beautifully landscaped gardens, it invites visitors to explore its rich history.

AL AIN OASIS

The UAE's first UNESCO World Heritage site, spanning over 1,200 hectares and home to over 147,000 date palms. The oasis is a peaceful retreat, featuring a traditional irrigation system called 'aflaj' that has been in use for centuries, offering visitors a glimpse into Al Ain's historical water management.

AL AIN PALACE MUSEUM

Built in 1937 as a residence for Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, the palace was later converted into a museum. The museum showcases traditional Emirati architecture and provides insight into the life of the late ruler and the history of the UAE.

SOUQ AL QATTARA

Dating back to the mid-20th century and founded by Sheikh Shakhbut bin Sultan Al Nahyan, this traditional souq has been renovated. It hosts a handicrafts market every Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, promoting local crafts and traditions.

AL QATTARA ARTS CENTRE

Originally the Al Qattara Fort, this cultural venue is located on a mound overlooking the Qattara Oasis. It offers a space for arts and culture, with workshops, exhibits, and performances for both the local community and visitors.

HAZZA BIN ZAYED STADIUM

A landmark stadium in Al Ain and home to Al Ain FC. The design is inspired by the trunk of a palm tree, symbolizing the UAE's cultural heritage. The

stadium is part of a larger development including residential, commercial, and entertainment areas.

UAE UNIVERSITY

Established in 1976, UAE University is the oldest university in the UAE and a leading research-based institution. It has produced many prominent leaders, including ministers, diplomats, and business leaders.

SHEIKH KHALIFA BIN ZAYED GRAND MOSQUE

Known also as Al Ain Grand Mosque, this grand mosque can accommodate up to 20,000 worshippers. It includes a large dome and minarets, and is a significant religious and architectural landmark in Al Ain.

AL AIN ZOO

A 900-hectare park near the base of Jebel Hafeet, home to over 4,000 animals. The zoo focuses on conservation and offers a natural environment for endangered species, with plenty of green spaces for picnics and a train tour of the wildlife area.

GREEN MUBAZZARAH

Located at the base of Jebel Hafeet, this scenic area features chalets with luxurious accommodations, hot springs, waterfalls, and lush green hillsides. It is an ideal retreat for those seeking relaxation away from the city.

JEBEL HAFEET

The UAE's second-highest peak, standing 1,240 meters tall. It offers spectacular views over Al Ain and is known for its rich geological history, including ancient burial tombs and fossil discoveries.

QASR AL MUWAIJI

A historic fort that has played a major role in UAE history. Built in the early 20th century, it has served as a residence for the ruling family and a community gathering place. The fort offers a glimpse into the UAE's governance and heritage.

HILI ARCHAEOLOGICAL PARK

The technical guide of the UAE tour 2025 details each stage, timetables, start and finish sites, distances in kilometres together with the relevant stage route maps and profiles. The race director, subject to prior notification to the PCP, can change the timetables and/or itineraries, if need be, giving prior notice to the interested parties. (Article 2.2.029 UCI) Furthermore, he might summon the representatives for the "Extreme Weather Protocol" in compliance with article 2.2.029 bis UCI. In such a situation, decisions can be taken and/or confirmed on the morning of the stage (See the "Extreme Weather Protocol" Part II Annex B UCI).

ART. 2 - TYPE OF RACE

The race is reserved to Men Elite Category and points will be awarded for the "Individual UCI World Ranking", according to the provisions set out in Articles 2.10.002 and 2.10.008 UCI.

Final General Classification

To the first 60 Riders respectively: 300-250-215-175-120-115-95-75-60-50-40-35-30-25-20 (from the 15th to the 20th) -12 (from the 21th to the 30th) -5 (from the 31th to the 50th) -2 (from the 51th to the 55th) -1 (from the 56th to the 60th) points.

Stage Classification

To the first 10 Riders respectively: 40-25-20-15-10-8-6-3-2-1 points.

Wearing the leader jersey (per stage)

Points 6

ART. 3 - ENROLLMENT

According to Article 2.1.005 and 2.1.007 bis UCI, the race is reserved to: UCI WorldTeams - UCI Pro Teams - National Team of the host country. In compliance with Article 2.2.003 UCI, the number of Riders per team shall be 7 (seven).

In any case, the Organization, so as to safeguard the image and the reputation of its race, reserves the right to reject, up to the start, the Riders or the Teams which, by their acts or statements, would prove to neglect the principles of sport fair play and the undertaken commitments as set forth in Article 1.1.023 UCI.

Furthermore, in the event the Riders or the Team should fail during the race in complying with the principles set out in the foregoing paragraph, the Organization shall also reserve the right to expel them from the race at any time, in compliance with the Article 2.2.010 bis UCI.

ART. 4 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

The subjects listed hereunder are liable for the enforcement of the present regulations and – for all that is not regulated under the present ruling – of the current regulations issued by the International Cycling Union:

- the titular race Riders;
- the Sports Directors and the Teams' staff;



The Emirati Marshals Program is a professional sports volunteering program aimed at empowering youth and fostering a culture of sports volunteering.

The Emirati Marshals Program collaborates with the Abu Dhabi Sports Council to organize the UAE Tour for the ninth consecutive year, involving more than 1,000 volunteers.



REGULATIONS

- all the Race's followers duly accredited by the Organizers in a recognized and acknowledged official position.

Only the persons notified upon getting the identification badge by the owners of the authorized vehicles are entitled to follow the race. Each and every change or addition shall be notified to the Organization Manager. The cars and motorcycles' drivers shall comply not only with the enforced rules of the Highway Code, but also with the provisions issued by the Organization Manager and his staff. Persons without any function acknowledged by the Organizers or relevant to the race's services as well as under-aged persons are not allowed to follow the race.

In the event of non-compliance about "the circulation during the race" will apply to the articles of the Part 2 Road Races, Chapter 2, paragraph 4, UCI regulations.

The Organizing Society shall not be accountable for any damage caused by accidents or incidents before, during and after the race to spectators or people in general, even if not involved in the race itself, because of actions that have not been performed by the Organization itself.

For all that is not regulated under the present ruling, the regulations issued by the UCI are enforced.

ART. 5 - RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF RIDERS

All registered Riders have the right, in compliance with the regulations in force, to compete in all the classifications – i.e. stage classification, general and special classifications – inscribed in the race program.

They are required to maintain a responsible race behavior and to refrain from promoting or supporting any mass demonstration susceptible to assume the character of either fraudulent agreements prejudicing other Competitors, or to appear as a protest against the Organizing Society or the Commissaires' Panel or other official followers whatsoever. Moreover, the titular Riders are requested:

- A)** to carry a frame number and two body numbers duly provided by the Organization. These numbers cannot be modified as far as their size is concerned. During time trial stage only one identification number will be required. (Articles.1.3.076/077 UCI)
- B)** to carry on all the stages including the ITT a transponder supplied by the Organization and to be affixed on the frame of the bicycle, for the automatic reading of their passage position on the finish line and in some other segments determined by the Organization. However, the crossing of the finish line will be the final reference for the stage classification.

Failure in complying with such obligation shall be considered as an infringement equivalent to the absence of body number and consequently punished in accordance with UCI Table 2.12.007/3.5.3

- C)** to wear the jersey corresponding to their relevant team as well as the World Championship or National Championship jerseys; in order of priority in compliance of the Article 1.3.071 UCI.
- D)** the leaders of the General Classification, the Points Classification, the Best Young Rider Classification, the Intermediate Sprints Classification, shall respectively wear the Red jersey, the Green jersey, the White jersey, the Black jersey, all of them duly provided by the Organizing Society. This order also features the priority between the different leader's distinctive jerseys, so that in the case a Rider should be leading more than one classification, he would wear the distinctive jersey having a priority in the above-mentioned order. The remaining jerseys would be put on, at an honorific title, by the next following Riders in the ranking of the respective classifications, provided that they are not already entitled to a different classification (Article 2.6.018 UCI). The jersey-holder is required to wear his distinctive garment beginning from the signature procedure until to the prize-giving ceremony and during any possible press conference;
- E)** to refrain from answering to interviews during the race.
- F)** to quickly leave the left side (or right only if safer) of the road free for motorcycles and vehicles authorized to overtake the peloton;
- G)** in case of drop-out in the course of the race, to remit the body number to a Commissaire or to the "Broom wagon".
- H)** to refrain – after having crossed the finish line – from crossing the line a second time while still wearing his body number, and thus until the finish judge or the finish Commissaire in charge authorize the crossing (UCI Table 2.12.007/1.6)
- I)** The General Classification leader and the stage winner shall show up at the press room or the for a press conference with the accredited journalists (Article 2.2.082 UCI).
- J)** to undergo the Anti-Doping procedure, the convened Riders shall go to the premises indicated by the Organizer.
- K)** to behave appropriately with a respectable behavior in line with the local tradition and regulations, using all the carefulness necessary. For example, riders shall use structures that the organizer will provide like changing rooms and bathrooms in all start and finish areas.
To pay particular attention to the environment while disposing of trash and empty bottles.

ART. 6 – RACE HEADQUARTERS

The official accreditations and preliminary operations will take place in Abu Dhabi on the premises of Radisson Blu Hotel - YAS Island – YAS Plaza from 14:00 to 18:00 on Saturday 15th and from 10:00 to 18:00 on Sunday 16th February 2025.

REGULATIONS

The confirmation of the starting Riders and the collection of the race numbers by the Sports Directors is set at the Race Headquarters on February 16th from 15:00 to 15:45, subsequently at 16:00 at the Race Headquarters is due to take place the Meeting with the Organization Management, the Commissaires Panel, the Sports Directors and with the presence of UCI Technical Delegate, according to the provisions set out in Articles 1.2.087-88/2.2.093 UCI.

On 17th February at 10:30 - the Race Director with the President of Commissaires' Panel will hold "Race security briefing" for all Drivers, cars and motorcycles, which will be involved in the race convoy, with a Representative of the television production and with a Representative of the Highway Police, see Article 2.2.034 bis UCI.

ART. 7 – PRELIMINARY OPERATIONS AT THE START

For each stage the Riders shall assemble at the place mentioned in the Technical Guide. As far as road race stages are concerned, the presence of the Riders at the Podium for the signature of starting sheet is mandatory, and teams shall be required to turn up, all Riders together, according to a given order that will be communicated every day (Article 2.3.009 UCI). Then, the Riders, in peloton, will gather for the transfert towards km 0.

ART. 8 - TOP-RIDERS PHOTO SHOOTING AND TEAM PRESENTATION

The organizer may will Top-Riders photo shooting and their press conference, Organization will communicate the list of riders. Teams will make available the Top-Riders requested with the support of team press officer.

All the Teams, with all their Riders and two Team Managers and/or Sports Directors shall take part in the opening and teams presentation ceremony in case it will be organized.

ART. 9 – RADIO INFORMATION

Race news will be broadcasted on the frequency VHF 149.850 MHz. Organizers will provide the radio for every car in the race and to all vehicles or person shall need it.

ART. 10 – TIMEKEEPING

The Timekeepers Service, with the assistance of the finish Judge, will be in charge of recording the official time. The service will be guarantee by EMG Italy SpA. Riders will

be provided with a transponder, for the automatic reading of their time, to be affixed on the frame of the bicycle compulsarily.

ART. 11 – TIME BONUSES

Time Bonus valid for the General Individual Classification are envisaged in each stage except the time trial stage. According to the Article 2.6.019 UCI regulations, the time bonuses will be as follows:

- for each Intermediate sprint the time bonuses for the first three riders crossing the line will be respectively 3", 2" and 1"
- upon finishing each stage respectively 10", 6" and 4" time bonuses will be assigned to the first three riders crossing the line.

ART. 12 SIGNPOSTS

The Organizing Society shall place the necessary signposts along the race route under the supervision of the Safety Manager Mr Stefano Allocchio. For each stage, detailed information about safety and about the road's situation will be provided in the "Daily Race Communiqués". (Articles 2.2.015/1.2.064 UCI)

ART. 13 – GREEN ZONES AND FEED ZONES

Fixed "Feed Zones" will be set up every 30-40 km depending on the route characteristic and will be preceded and followed by Green Zones, article 2.3.025 UCI. The zones will be signposted along the race route, listed on route maps and in the time schedules as well as. Organization is committed to collect all the waste referred to the race and invites all the stakeholders to behave in way respectful of environment safeguard.

ART. 14 – TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

The technical assistance service is provided for by 3 vehicles of the SHIMANO company.

ART. 15 – MEDICAL SERVICE

The Medical Service appointed by the Race Manager, is provided by an adequate number of Doctors and Paramedics; the service is operative during the race and available before the start and after the finish of the race. In case of need, following ambulances coordinated by the race Doctors will take the Riders to the hospitals mentioned in the Technical Guide.

ART. 16 – STAGE FINISHES

Stage finishes shall be announced in advance by a red triangle located one kilometer from the finish line and by an arch in coincidence with the time keeping and photo finish line. It is mandatory for all vehicles to perform a detour from the race route where indicated

by the Organizer, in order not to cross the finish line, exception for the Race Management, the Commissaires' Panel and the official Doctor vehicles, article 2.3.006 UCI.

In the case of a crash, puncture or mechanical incident beyond the signpost indicating the finish within three kilometres, the rider(s) affected shall be credited with the time of the group in whose company he was (they were) when the accident occurred, in compliance with Articles 2.6.027/2.6.028 UCI.

The rule does not apply to stages featuring a summit finish (3rd and 7th). For all that is not regulated under this ruling, the irrevocable decision taken by the Commissaires' Panel in consultation with the Organization Management shall apply.

The "Protocol for stages expected to finish in bunch sprints" will be enforced in stages 1, 4, 5 and 6 for calculating time gaps.

ART. 17 – INDIVIDUAL TIME TRIAL STAGE

The Riders shall use bicycles complying with the parameters and measures set up by the UCI Regulations.

On the start line, the Riders will be held by personnel appointed by the Race Direction. Each Rider will be escorted by one motorbike, in front, and by one car. The car shall follow at least 25 meters behind the Riders and shall never draw up level with him. (Articles 2.4.023/024/025 UCI)

The Race Director, by common consent with the PCP, is empowered to adopt changes on the start list, agreed upon the teams' manager meeting in order to help the teams in assisting their riders.

The starting order will be drawn up as follows:

the reverse order of the individual general classification after the first stage will not be followed, but one rider per team will start every 19' as if it were the first stage, except for the classification leader who will start last.

Each team will indicate the starting order of their Riders in the form which will be given to teams at the technical meeting.

The succession of starts (with regard to the teams) will be established taking into account the general classification at the end of the second stage.

Riders shall set off at identical intervals of 1' to 3', the Race Director, by common consent with the PCP, is empowered to adopt different intervals as far as the last 15 Riders to set off are concerned

ART. 18 – FINISHING TIME LIMIT

In order to determine the finishing time limit, the stages have been divided into three categories depending on the different nature of their route:

- A category: stages presenting no particular difficulty (Stage 1, 4, 5 and 6)
- B category: stages presenting difficulty (Stage 3 and 7)
- C category: Time Trial (stage 2)

Consequently, the time limit has been set out as follows:

- for the A category the winner's time plus:
 - 8% if the average speed is less than or equal to 40 Km/h.
 - 9% if the average speed is between 40 and 45 Km/h
 - 11% if the average speed is over 45 Km/h
- for the B category the winner's time plus:
 - 15% if the average speed is less than or equal to 37 km/h
 - 16% if the average speed is between 37 and 41 km/h
 - 17% if the average speed is over 41 km/h
- for the C category the winner's time plus 30%

According to Article 2.6.032 UCI, in case of exceptional circumstances, confirmed accidents or incidents, the Commissaires Panel, after consultation with the Organization Manager, may readmit in the race any Rider finishing in a time exceeding the time limit, by increasing the latter by a maximum of 30% of the time set out in this article. The time limit, established on the basis of the winner's time expressed in minute seconds, shall be further rounded off to the successive superior minute.

In case, for those Riders readmitted, all points awarded in the general classification of the various secondary classifications shall be withdrawn.

ART. 19 – PENALTIES

Infringements will be sanctioned according to UCI Rules and to the "Table of race incidents" (2.12.007 UCI).

ART. 20 – PRIZE-GIVING PROTOCOL

After every stage finish, the stage winner, the leader of the General Classification who receives the red jersey, the leader of the General Classification by Points who receives the green jersey, the leader of the Best Young Rider Classification who receives the white jersey and the leader of the Intermediate Sprints Classification who receives the black jersey shall attend the prize-giving ceremony. Moreover, the stage winner and the leader of the General Classification shall participate in the press conference for the accredited journalists. (Articles 1.2.112/113 and 2.6.018 bis UCI)

ART. 21 – ANTI-DOPING

Antidoping Control will be made on the dedicated premises by the finish area.

The Doping Control Officer (DCO) appointed by the ITA and acting on behalf of UCI will enforce the UCI Regulations, in compliance with the ITA's instructions and procedures, in accordance with Chapter 14 of the UCI ADR-TIR (Testing Investigation Rules) and with the relevant Law in force of the hosting country.

REGULATIONS

ART. 22 – GENERAL INDIVIDUAL CLASSIFICATION BY TIME

The Leader of the General Individual Classification will wear the Red jersey. In compliance with the provisions set out in Article 2.6.014 UCI, the General Individual Classification is established by adding together the times achieved by each rider in each stage. Time bonuses and penalties are considered for this classification. In the event of a tie in the General Individual Classification the first discriminating criteria is given by the fraction of seconds recorded in the ITT, the second is given by the lower sum of the placing obtained in each stage, as a last resort, the place obtained in the final stage is counted (Article 2.6.015 UCI).

ART. 23 – GENERAL INDIVIDUAL CLASSIFICATION BY POINTS

The Leader of the General Individual Classification by Points will wear the Green jersey. The individual points ranking is obtained by adding together the points recorded in each of the seven stages and the sum of the points assigned in all the Intermediate Sprints.

At each Intermediate Sprint points are awarded as follows:

To receive the prizes of the final General Classification Riders will have to complete the Race.

ART. 24 – BEST YOUNG RIDER

The Leader of the best Young Classification will wear the White jersey. The Best Young Classification is reserved to Riders born after 1st January 2000 and is determined by the General individual Classification.

ART. 25 – “INTERMEDIATE SPRINT JERSEY” CLASSIFICATION

The Leader of the Intermediate Sprint Classification shall wear the Black jersey. A special Intermediate Sprint Classification has been set up, at each Intermediate Sprint points are awarded as follows:

The general ranking is established by the sum of the points obtained. In the event of a tie in the Intermediate Sprint general classification, the following discriminating criteria will be applied:

- number of Intermediate Sprint victories
- general individual classification by time

To receive the prizes of the final General Classification Riders will have to complete the Race.

ART. 26 – TEAM CLASSIFICATION

According to the provisions set out in Article 2.06.016 UCI, the team classification is established on the basis of the sum of the three best individual times from each team. In the event of a tie the teams shall be separated by the sum of the places acquired by their three best times in the stage. If the teams are still tied, they shall be separated by the placing of their best rider on the stage classification. The team general classification shall be calculated on the basis of the three best individual times from each team in each stage ridden.

REGULATIONS

In the event of a tie the following criteria shall be applied in order until the teams are separated:

- number of first places in the daily team classifications;
- number of second places in the daily team classifications;
- etc.

If there is still a draw, the teams shall be separated by the placing of their best rider in the general individual classification. Any team reduced to fewer than three riders shall be eliminated from the general team classification.

ART. 27 – RACE MANAGEMENT

The UAE Tour race will be managed in compliance with the UCI regulations through the UCI Commissaires appointed according to the art. 1.1.070 and in collaboration with the RCS Sports technical race management coordinated by the Race Director Mauro Vegni (tel. +390225848766).

ART. 28 – REGULAR AND SPECIAL PRIZES
